Judging will be based on the quality of the entry, not the photo (except in the Photography classes) but judges will need to see the detail of the entry clearly and in a good light. Judges will make the best decision possible in the circumstances and their decision is final.

Entries are open to residents of Ponteland and the adjoining parishes of Heddon upon the Wall, Stamfordham, Belsay, Whalton, Stannington, Dinnington and Woolsington, to children attending schools and to members of organisations meeting in these parishes.

Your entry should be accompanied by your name and contact information. This information will only be used for the Show.

Digital editing should not be used except in the photography classes.

Exhibits must be the work of the exhibitor and photos must have been taken in 2020.
